From the Pastor's Desk

Friends, June kicks off what I hope will be an exciting partnership between Hillside, Downtown Ministries, and other local churches to do gospel-based ministry in the West End of Greenville.

Over the past year, my doctoral thesis project has involved investigating where Hillside might be able to coordinate its mission efforts with First Presbyterian. So a few people from each congregation have been meeting together to study, pray, and discern what God might be calling us to do together. We met with as many community leaders as we could, asking what unmet needs they saw.



Time and time again, the answer that came back was the concern for the youth in our community, especially for those who are underprivileged and have given up hope for a different and better life. So we began to pray and talk about how we felt God was leading us to reach out and befriend the young people in greatest need in our community.

Surprisingly (or not surprisingly, depending on your belief in God's work in the world), we learned that other churches had discerned that God was calling them to the exact same kind of ministry. In fact, unbeknownst to us, they had already begun experimenting on a program that they believed would help to befriend and lift up the needlest youth in Greenville, which they identified as several blocks in any direction surrounding Hillside's property.

While this was originally designed as a summer day camp, the team began to work on how they could expand those relationships throughout the school year, which led to the mentoring program that met in Hillside's fellowship hall periodically this past year.

Now, we're hoping to step-up our efforts to support and volunteer in doing ministry to the children in our own backyard (i.e. the field next to Agway). The program is still largely a day camp staffed by interns for children in 1-6 grade, but they are looking for volunteers to read, provide lunch, cook a meal for the interns one evening, chaperone on field trips, or teach them a special skill.

Recipe Corner

NO BAKE STRAWBERRY
JELLO LASAGNE

CRUST

36 Golden Oreos

½ cup melted butter

STRAWBERRY CHEESECAKE LAYER

8 oz. cream cheese, softened

½ cup butter, softened

1 cup powdered sugar

1½ cup whipped topping

1-1/3 cups diced fresh strawberries

STRAWBERRY JELLO LAYER

3 oz. box strawberry jello

½ cup boiling water

1 cup strawberry Greek yogurt

4 cups whipped topping

TOPPING

2-3 cups whipped topping

4-5 oz. white chocolate bars to make curls

Grind cookies in food processor and stir together with butter. Press into 9x13 pan. Freeze to firm.

Cream together, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter, 8 oz. cream cheese and 1 cup powdered sugar. Add $1\frac{1}{4}$ cups whipped topping. Gently fold in diced strawberries. Spread over crust. Refrigerate.

Dissolve jello in boiling water. Whisk in yogurt. Add 4 cups whipped topping. Spread mixture over cheesecake layer. Refrigerate 2-3 hours.

Spread 2 cups whipped topping over top.

Draw vegetable peeler over white chocolate bars to make curls and sprinkle over top.

Refrigerate
