From the Pastor's Desk

This month marks the longest amount of time I have ever lived anywhere in my entire life. Earlier this year I wondered if I would start to feel "claustrophobic," but as the time has come, I have to say I feel peaceful. In these newsletter articles, I ordinarily try to lift up something happening in the church or give you something to think about that will challenge you to grow as disciples, but I hope, for this month, you might excuse this moment of personal reflection.

For most of my entire life, everywhere I lived seemed to have an expiration date attached. Between my father's military career and my own educational or ministry pursuits, I have moved 19 times in the last 33 years. And now, coming up on 4 years at Hillside this fall, I feel settled with no "expiration date" on the horizon. So much of my life has been spent either settling-in or packing-up, that it comes as a strange, yet welcome, feeling to simply enjoy this moment of relative calm in my life, especially because, for the first time in 30 years, I'm no longer in school.

So what, you ask, am I going to be doing with my newfound peace and calm? Well, since you asked, I'm going to continue working on losing weight, improving my health, and investing in those things that, I hope, will help you to grow as disciples.

To that end, it is my fervent hope that each person at Hillside will demonstrate what it is to be transformed by the grace of God in Jesus Christ. And of course you can give yourself a test to see whether your life has been re-oriented: do you desire to know God more because you are continually amazed by his unfailing love for you despite how broken and sinful you are, or do you think that you basically know who God is already? Do you love being lord of your own life, seeking after your own comfort zone or are you always on the lookout for ways you can let God's will be done through you?

The answer to these questions will either lead us to basically keep doing the same things we've always done or strive to grow, be radically transformed, and serve in new and risky ways. This fall, I hope to challenge *each* of you to be a part of some kind of discipleship or study group AND be plugged in to some kind of outward service for others. These are the most basic actions that should be common to all believers of every age and what, I hope, we will spend our time working on together.

Recipe Corner

Strawberry Spinach Pasta Salad with Orange Poppy Seed Dressing

8 oz. penne pasta, cooked

2 cups packed fresh baby spinach leaves

1 cup sliced strawberries

1 cup pineapple chunks

 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup dried cranberries

½ cup salted cashews

Dressing:

½ cup extra virgin olive oil

1/3 cup apple cider vinegar

 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup plain Greek yogurt

1 TBL Dijon mustard

3 TBL honey

½ cup orange juice

2 teaspoons poppy seeds

Combine all dressing ingredients in a jar and shake well.

Combine pasta, spinach, strawberries, pineapple, cranberries, and cashews in a large bowl.

Toss with dressing

Cover and chill at least one hour.


