From the Pastor's Desk

Peter Drucker, a well known leadership and entrepreneurial expert, is famous (in part) for asking the question, "If we weren't already doing it this way, is this the way we would start?" The question is designed to identify where an organization has become stuck in a rut that is no longer serving them well. The question is such an important one for any organization to ask itself because it is so easy to find yourself doing something simply because it is comfortable or "we've always done it that way." Or perhaps, the way that we are doing things served us well in the past, and we had very good reasons for why we started doing it this way. The easiest course of actiion is to simply stay the course, but, Drucker says, organizations that hope to thrive will take time to evaluate and ask themselves this question. Naturally, the advice that follows is that if you would do things differently if you were starting over from scratch, then take immediate action to change the way that you are doing things.

Blockbuster Video is one of the most famous examples of an organization that failed to change course or ask themselves this question until it was far too late. At a time when Netflix was investing in instant streaming services and charging \$8 per month for all the DVDs you could watch, and Redbox was offering \$1 per day rentals from 24/7 kiosks, Blockbuster was asking \$4 per movie and still operating their brick and mortar stores almost the exact same way that they had 20 years earlier. And why not? Into the 1990's, Blockbuster was the (nearly undisputed) king of the video rental industry. The way that they had always done things had gotten them to the top, and no one wants to watch movies on their computer anyway, right!?

If Bloackbuster had taken the time to ask themselves Drucker's question, they might have realized that their primary function was to bring the latest video entertainment into people's homes. And in the computer age, if you were going to set up a company to get entertainment into people's homes, would you start by renting out DVDs from a physical store? The answer is, as the economy has demonstrated, of course not. Between 2000 and 2010, Blockbuster's estimated worth dropped from nearly 5 billion to 25 million. Yet still, as recently as 2008, Blockbuster's CEO was saying, "I've been frankly confused by this fascination that everybody has with Netflix...Netflix doesn't really have or do anything that we can't or don't already do ourselves."


The reason I mention Drucker's question and lift up this story to you is to ask, "Where in the church, if we weren't already doing things the way we currently do them, would we choose to do them exactly the same way that we are currently doing them, and where would we do things differently?" If our organization is primarily about having a storefront that provides religious goods and services, could we do it better? If our organization were primarily about getting the gospel of Jesus into the hearts and lives of our neighbors and advancing God's Kingdom in Greenville, I wonder if we wouldn't start by doing things *radically* differently than we're doing them now!?



Recipe Corner



LOADED POTATO SOUP

2 lbs. russet potatoes, peeled and cubed 1/4 flour
2 cups milk
1 cup chicken stock
3/4 cup sour cream
11/4 teaspoons salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
2/3 cup shredded cheddar cheese
6 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled
3 Tablespoons chopped chives

Place potatoes in Dutch oven. Cover with cold water, bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer until tender, 11-14 minutes. Drain

Return potatoes to pan and mash with a potato masher to desired consistency. Whisk together flour, milk and chicken stock.

Stir milk mixture into potatoes, cook over medium heat until thickened and bubbly. Remove from heat. Stir in sour cream, salt and pepper.

Ladle soup into 6 bowls. Top with bacon, shredded cheesed chives.
