From the Pastor's Desk

As many of you know, my grandfather recently passed away. He was the one who took me on mission trips, most encouraged me to pursue ministry, and showed me what it meant to live as a disciple of Jesus. On the surface, we might not have had much in common. He worked with his hands for a living, barely graduated from high school, and wasn't particularly eloquent, but I never met a man who had more of a heart for God or who lived day in and day out with an absolute certainty of who he was in relation to the grace of God in Christ.

He had the kind of heart that the Bible describes in King David. We are going to be spending the next 6 months taking a look at David's life, and learning what it means to live with a heart for God. My grandfather taught me two important lessons that I will never forget. First, there is nothing so small or insignificant that we can not take it to God in prayer. I remember telling him once that I couldn't find my keys. "Have you prayed about it?" was his reply. He told me that he prayed about everything all day long. Whether he was praying about tightening bolts on the machines he fixed or praying for important family matters, his life was a never-ending conversation with God. I see this same trait in the life of David, who was constantly stopping to ask God's will over the smallest decisions.

The second great lesson that he taught me was tithing. When I got my first job, he said, "the first 10% of everything you earn belongs to God, and it will never be easier to start tithing than when you get your first paycheck. I have been blessed beyond measure with a good family and a successful business, and I firmly believe it has been because I put God first in all things and never held back what belonged to Him." For him, giving to the church was a measuring stick for how much you were placing your trust in God.


Giving is by no means the only measurement for whether we are living as disciples, but it is one of the few tangible markers that shows us how close we are to living according to God's will. On January 28, we will be having a congregational meeting to hear the proposed budget for 2018. The session has already recognized that we are going to need to step out in faith if we're going to make this budget and if we hope to do meaningful ministry in Greenville. We are going to be taking a hard look at ourselves this year as asking what we need to do to live as disciples of Jesus. And the first of many steps, as the year begins, is to look at our annual household budgets and ask if our giving for last year was 10% of our adjusted gross income. Were we even in the ballpark? And if not, let's ask ourselves what we can do to become the disciples we hope to be in 2018



Recipe Corner

SIMPLE SLOW-COOKED KOREAN BEEF SOFT TACOS

1-3 lb. beef chuck roast

 $\frac{1}{2}$ onion, diced

¹/₂ cup dark brown sugar

1/3 cup soy sauce

10 cloves garlic

1 jalapeno pepper, diced (optional)

1" piece fresh ginger, grated

2 TBL. seasoned rice vinegar

1 TBL. sesame oil

Combine ingredients in slow cooker. Cook on high 8 hours, or on low, 10 hours. Shred beef with forks.

Serve on soft tortillas with your favorite toppings.
