

Rev. Michael and Rachel Weller are nationally respected missionaries who were sent from Western Pennsylvania to the people of Ethiopia. Although the Weller's schedule is usually booked up to a year in advance, First Presbyterian Church has arranged for them to come to town and they have invited us to join them. Having them visit Greenville is such an honor that Hillside's session has decided to undertake an historic event that, to my knowledge, has never occurred in the history of our church.

As regional liaison for the Horn of Africa, Michael works with Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) global partners and mission co-workers in Ethiopia, Sudan, and South Sudan to facilitate strong relationships with the PC(USA) and our African brothers and sisters.


