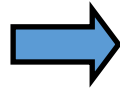


Setting Up Automatic Payments is as easy as



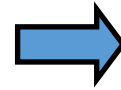
1.

Use your computer to log into your bank's website & sign up for online banking — a free service your bank offers. You can keep tabs on your finances and even check your account balances in real time. The whole process is reliable, easy, and secure.

Find the "Pay Bills" section of the website and tell your bank how often, how much, and on what days you want a check sent to the church (or anywhere else you'd like to send money). Then give them our name and address:

Next, the bank will write-out and mail checks directly to the church, saving you time and money. They take care of the checks, envelopes, & postage at no cost to you! Now you'll never get behind in your giving if you have to miss worship.
